A WINTER OF WARMTH: A Quiet Gift from an Anonymous Heart

As winter of 2025 arrived early and harsh in Michigan, Refugee Hope International and its partners responded swiftly to support refugee families facing the sudden chill.

In the midst of these efforts, one woman—who prefers to remain anonymous—heard about the urgent need and went straight to a local dollar store. Within hours she arrived at RHI with bags of children's socks and gloves.

As RHI team delivered the hats door-to-door—especially to the families who were unable to shop for winter clothing—parents held them gently and children's face lit up. They tried them on immediately, smiling with joy. Their eyes were bright, saying, "***Someone cared.***"

Someone they had never met thought of them, shopped for them, and wanted them warm. These moments remind us that kindness, even in small packages, carries enormous warmth. "***Together, we make winter a season of care.***"

These simple acts of kindness transformed cold days into moments of warmth, dignity, and connection.



ANITA'S YEAR-LONG GIFT OF KINDNESS TO REFUGEE CHILDREN

Anita's journey started during the COVID shutdown, when she suddenly found herself with unexpected time and a desire to do something meaningful for others. She recalled, "Then I thought, 'I'm going to donate'. And this is something I can do for the community, which is in my control. And that's where it all started."

Through the year, she knitted patiently—switching colors when she felt inspired, trying new patterns when grew bored of old ones, and working through her favorite TV shows. Every stitch carried warmth. Every thread carried dignity. Every hat carried love.

Because of Anita's year-long labor of love, dozens of refugee children stepped into Michigan's early winter with warmth on their heads and comfort in their hearts. Her story reminds us that consistent kindness of a person can touch many lives.

At Refugee Hope International, we celebrate Anita and all the community members who help make this winter season a season of care, generosity and hope.
